



White-In-Hole

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There's a popular tool for painting the top of the cup hole white. It's a slick arrangement made out of stainless-steel with a special can of paint that works upside down. It works reasonably well but the ring costs over \$70 and the paint about \$10 a can. The rings are fairly delicate and we've broken several. Usually I can silver solder them back together again.

What we tried was to take one of the broken rings, and riveted it in a piece of 1/4 inch by 2 foot rubber mat. We made ours round with the tool lip on the underside. On the top we mounted a handle. To use it we just put it on the hole, and go around it with a can of white turf paint. So far it's been indestructible and quick. The standard turf paint costs about \$3 a can.
